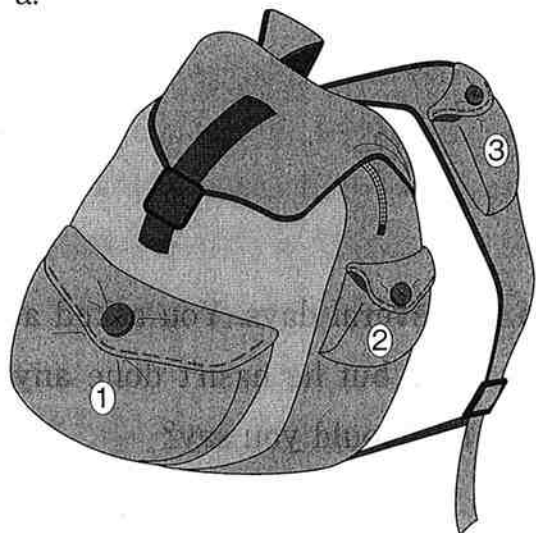

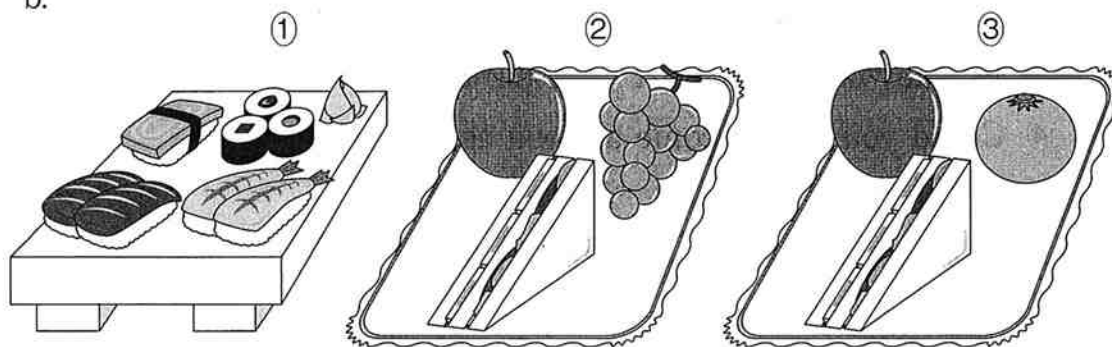

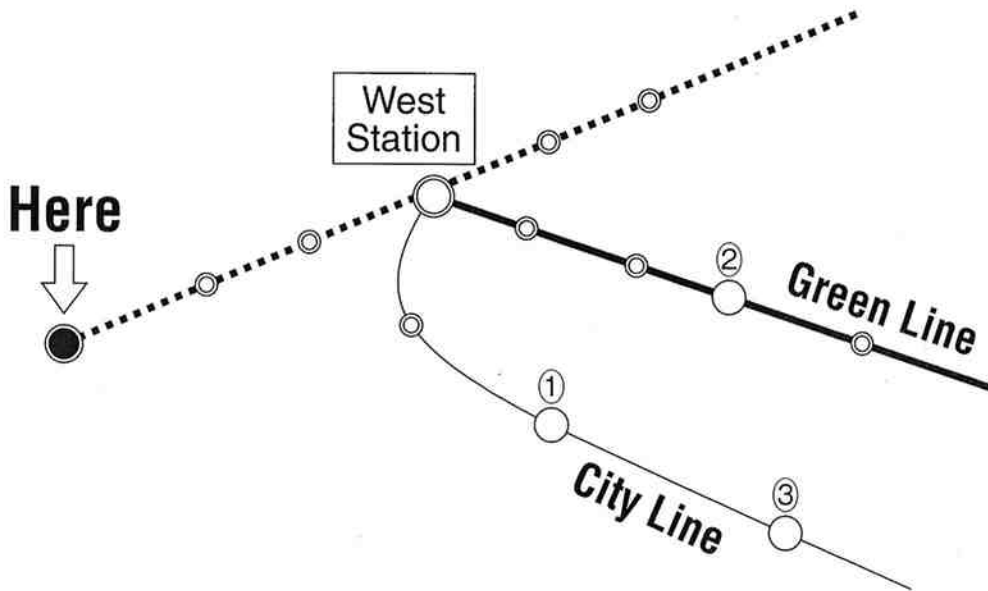

There's an old saying: "Eat breakfast like a king, lunch like a prince, and dinner like a poor man." In most countries, dinner is the biggest meal of the day. So why does this proverb tell us to eat a a[① light ② large ③ plain ④ simple] breakfast instead?

The answer is in the word "breakfast" itself. It means the "breaking" of a "fast" – a long period without b[① eating ② resting ③ sleeping ④ speaking]. The time between dinner and breakfast can be more than twelve hours, so the meal that breaks your "fast" is very important. It c[① can't ② might ③ should ④ won't] be healthy and *¹nutritious. Also, *²unlike your evening meal, the food you eat for breakfast gives you the energy you need during the most active part of your day.

In the U.S., for example, lots of people don't eat breakfast or only have a cup of coffee in the morning. About two-thirds of the population still have their main meal in the evening. There are many healthy foods you can choose – the important thing is to start your day with breakfast, and get the *⁵nutrition you need.
