



In 1847 Levi Strauss came from Germany to New York to join his older brothers, Jonas and Louis. They were running a shop selling cloth. From there, Levi Strauss went to San Francisco in March 1853 to start his own shop. Before he started his business, the Gold Rush had already begun in California in 1848. So, many people were moving there from many parts of the country to find gold.

The workers needed strong pants and shirts that could stand rough working conditions. One of the *tailors that tried to make stronger clothes was Jacob Davis, a tailor from Reno, Nevada, who often bought cloth from Levi's shop. The only problem Jacob had was that the pants he made broke easily at the pockets. He tried many things to make the pants stronger. At last he thought of using small pieces of metal to fix the pockets. That idea worked very well and the strong pants he made sold quickly.

Jacob Davis wanted to **patent the idea but didn't have enough money to do so. He wrote a letter to Levi Strauss asking him for the money. Later they opened a factory together and it became a great success. This is how their pants became well-known as jeans all over the world.

Every year, *wildfires (ⓐ) large areas of forest land. Homes are damaged, and thousands of people die. Smokejumpers help to stop this. Smokejumpers are special firefighters. They jump from planes or are lowered by helicopters into areas that are difficult to reach by car or on foot, such as the middle of a mountain forest. They race to put out fires as (ⓑ) as they can.
